

Treasurer Report

Dear members,

it is hard to believe that we are already $2\frac{1}{2}$ months into the new year 2021. After our holiday season we had to lockdown again for two weeks due to the Covid -19 outbreak in WA. Unfortunately, this has affected our income for the first guarter of the year which is the last guarter of our financial year.

I'm very pleased to inform the members that we have been successful in our application of the Community Capital Works Fund. Off the AUD 3 million Budget by the Government, they received applications for AUD 8 Million. We have been awarded AUD 153.000 to replace our entire roof. This is an extremely big help for the club as we had planned to do it in 3 Stages and the Members had approved AUD 45.000 for this year. Now we can do all of the roof at once and it will be nearly fully paid by the grant. This will give us the opportunity to do some other improvement on the buildings, which are also well overdue.

Thank you to everybody who helped me prepare the grant.

I would also like to remind the group leaders that we will need your stock take of your inventory by the 25th of March, at the latest. Please be aware that you have to include the date of puchase and cost (if it is available) of the replacement value. This value will be the basis for our insurance of all equipment.

Der Rolls Royce Ibn Sauds

Während des Zweiten Weltkrieges wurde ein Rolls Royce zur Schachfigur im Spiel internationalen Grössenwahns zwischen Winston Churchill und Franklin D. Roosevelt. Als Roosevelt König Ibn Saud von Saudi-Arabien in wohlberech-neter Grosszügigkeit ein Flugzeug vom Typ C-47 zum Geschenk machte, war der britische Stolz herausgefordert. Churchill engagierte schnell einige erfahrene Rolls Royce Experten und liess von diesen eine wahrhaft königliche Karosse anfertigen. Im Fond der Limousine befand sich ein Thron, der so breit war, dass der König nach arabischer Art dort mit gekreuzten Beinen sitzen konnte. Der Wagen war mit Sirenen, Suchscheinwerfern und extrabreiten Trittbrettern für die Leibwächter ausgestattet. Die Karosserie war in einem schimmernden Grün, also in der Farbe des Propheten, gehalten. Die Ledersitze und die gesamte Innenaus -stattung hatte man in einen metallgünen Farbton getaucht. Für die nach moslemischer Sitte übliche Ablution hatte der König im hinteren Teil des Wagens einen kupfernen Wassertank und ein Becken aus Sterling-Silber, das nach hinten gekippt wurde, so dass sein Inhalt durch einen Abfluss im Boden ablief. Zu den weiteren Ausstattungen gehörte ein Radio, alabasterne Thermosfläschchen und ein eingebautes Schränkchen für Bürsten und Kämme. Die Bürsten waren mit Rücksicht auf Ibn Sauds moslemischen Glaubens, mit Nylon anstatt Schweineborsten versehen. So wurde also schon in den vierziger Jahren dem saudi-arabishen Königshaus der Hof gemacht.

All four were finalists in all their events with Siobhy winning the Bronze medal in her 2 events behind Australia's two Olympic representatives selected for the Tokyo Olympics. Due to Covid-19 travel restrictions the WA competitors were Zoomed into Brisbane from the Whiteman Park range for the live fire events and from our Rhein Donau air range using the electronic target system.Rhein Donau was well represented at the Cockburn Fremantle Open, our club t-shirts the most prominent on the ranges with 8 members competing and 4 eligible to represent the Pistol Group. Our juniors, Hannah Bassola, Katie and Siobhy Nicholls made a clean sweep of the junior events and then in the Woman's 10m Air Pistol Katie took 1st place 2 points ahead of sister Siobhy with club



member Stephanie de Jong (representing Whiteman Park) 3rd. Hannah won the B Grade 10 points clear of the next competitor. The positions were reversed in the 25m Woman's Pistol event with Stephanie in 1st place ahead of Siobhy in second 3 points ahead of sister Katie. Our members, Mike Giustiniano, Scott Anderson and Murray Bow although representing other clubs were in the top three in most of their events or placed in grade competitions.
